

## BVP MYSTERY QUILT – FEBRUARY 2010

This month we'll do another block which should be  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " ( $9 \frac{1}{2}$ ",  $6 \frac{1}{2}$ ") unfinished size. You will be making a total of four of these blocks—for once all the same color placement. When we put the quilt top together, these blocks will be rotated to make color placement right.

Once again we will be making half-square triangle units. For this month's block we'll be using the  $3 \frac{7}{8}$ " ( $3 \frac{1}{8}$ ",  $2 \frac{3}{8}$ ") squares, cut diagonally once. Use your preferred method of making half-square triangle units to create:

32 half-square triangle squares using Fabric A and Fabric B

8 half-square triangle squares using Fabric E and Fabric F

8 half-square triangle squares using Fabric D and Fabric F

After you have all your half-square triangle squares made, following the diagram below, create 4 rows paying careful attention to the placement of each half-square triangle unit. Then sew the 4 rows together to create the block.

Press the blocks, mark the top, and place in a baggy labeled as Block 2.
