Mystery Quilt Pattern 2006-2007

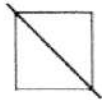
**Step 2 (November)**

**Cutting:** Strips are cut across the width of the fabric making them approximately 42" long.

Fabric #1 – Cut five 4 1/8" wide strips. Cut these strips into forty-eight (48) 4 1/8" squares.  
Cut the squares twice diagonally to make four quarter-square triangles from each.  
Yields 192 triangles.



Cut two 2 3/8" wide strips. Cut these strips into thirty-two (32) 2 3/8" squares.  
Cut these squares once diagonally to make two half-square triangles from each.  
Yields 64 triangles.



Fabric #2 – Cut four 2 1/2" wide strips. Cut these strips into sixty-four (64) 2 1/2" squares.

Fabric #3 – Cut two 6 1/2" wide strips. Cut these strips into thirty two (32) 2 1/2" X 6 1/2" rectangles.

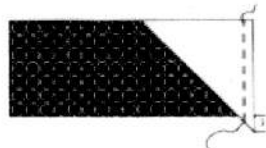
**Piecing:**

Sew a quarter-square triangle to fabric 1 to the two ends of each of the thirty-two rectangles of fabric 3. Make sure they are positioned exactly as shown in the sketch below.



Press the seam allowance toward the rectangle.

*Tip:* When placing the triangle in position, the tip will extend 3/8" beyond the rectangle at the bottom as shown in the sketch at the right. Don't ease this in and try to make it match at the seam line. Doing that robs part of the seam allowance from the next seam.



Sew the remaining quarter-square triangles of fabric 1 to two opposite sides of the sixty-four squares of fabric 2. Align them as directed above and make sure they are positioned exactly as shown in the sketch below.  
Press the seam allowances toward the triangles.



Sew a half-square triangle of fabric 1 to each of the units you just completed. Press the seam allowances toward the triangles.
