Who Am I? An interesting question! This year's challenge is two-fold:

- 1) To create a quilted item (wall hanging, purse, doll, etc.) that easily identifies who you are. If making an item other than a quilt, it must have some kind of quilted element as a part of it. The guild members will then get to try to guess who goes with each quilted challenge! You can create a portrait quilt that looks just like you, or you can think "outside the box" and create something that immediately identifies who you are by the elements included in it. As an example: my mom absolutely LOVES her dog and all the neighborhood dogs love her, too, since she always carries dog treats in her pockets to hand out to any dog she meets. It would be easy to identify her if I saw a challenge showing a woman walking a dog wearing a coat with pockets full of dog treats. It's a part of who she is that is very recognizable. You can create something very traditional or let your inner Picasso play. But the challenge is to create something that identifies you to others. There will be ribbons for 1st, 2nd & 3rd place, plus the one receiving the most votes wins a free guild membership for next year.
- 2) All guild members get to play, too, by trying to see who can match the most number of challenges correctly with their creator. The more challenges created, the more fun this will be! The guild member who correctly matches the most quilted items with its creator wins something, too!
