NOTES ON THE 2023 QUILT SHOW and LOOKING AHEAD

Our Quilt Show Committee had a "Wrap-Up" meeting recently, and while all the paperwork isn't finalized yet, we were able to get an idea of how the show went and what we'd like to work on for next year. As most are now aware, our 2023 show had the most quilts we've ever been able to hang for a show – 117! The judge sent us a nice Thank-You note, saying how well-prepared we were and how nicely we treated her, for which she was very appreciative. Our attendance was up slightly, with 26 additional paying customers from the previous year. The kitchen, under the new leadership of Alycia Lyons, did a brisk business and we heard many comments about the great food! The boutique also did a lot of business, so our members were able to make some extra spending money for the upcoming holidays! Janice is wrapping up all the paperwork on the invoices and receipts, so we should be getting the final numbers before too long.

The theme for next year's show is "The Joy of Winter." A quilt pattern ("So This is Christmas") and fabric have already been purchased, and work is already well underway! Sharon has decided she'd rather not be in charge this year, so Vivian was happy to step up and be chairman again for 2024. She's working on finding a Co-Chair for 2024 who will be interested in heading up the show in 2025. The Community Life Center of the UMC of Chippewa will again host the show – the contract for the rental of the building is signed and we are set for the show to be held October 10th, 11th and 12th, 2024.

Some changes are in store for our next show, including raising the cost of entrance to the show to \$10, with children under 12 admitted free. This is similar to many other shows in the area, and with the cost of rent going up every year, it was inevitable. Our costs have also gone up on the storage facility where we store the racks and other items for the shows, as well as on most everything we buy for the show. We will continue to work through the issues and plan to have the best show ever in 2024! Thanks for your continued support!!
