### Placemats to Show That Someone Cares

This year's Community Service Project is to make quilted placemats for seniors in need that will be delivered by the local Meals on Wheels organization. The placemats can be as simple as two pieces of fabric and binding or pieced blocks. This is an ideal project for scraps, learning to quilt as you go, using up orphan blocks, or practicing free motion quilting. The placemats can be of any size, but a typical placemat is 12 inches by 18 inches.

The following are a couple of recipes that were enjoyed at the August 4<sup>th</sup> picnic. Thanks to all who attended!!

### KALE CHIPS - [Myron and Deb Elliott](#)

1 head Kale, washed and thoroughly dried  
Salt  
2+Tblsp. Olive Oil  
Parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 275 degrees.

Remove the ribs from the kale and cut into approx. 1-1/2" to 2" pieces. Toss with olive oil, rub each piece to completely coat kale leaves with the olive oil. Lay lightly oil-coated leaves on cookie sheet and sprinkle with salt and parmesan cheese. Bake until crisp, about 20 minutes, turning leaves over halfway through.

\*Note-Can use any other seasoning you like instead of or with the parmesan, such as dry ranch dressing mix, Cajun seasoning, smoked paprika, etc.

### SUCCOTASH SALAD - [Ann Niemann](#)

Perfect for summer picnics

Serves 4 to 6

1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil, divided  
¼ cup white wine vinegar  
2 tsp table salt, divided  
1 tsp pepper  
1 (15 oz) can butter beans, drained and rinsed  
8 oz cherry tomatoes  
1 zucchini, cut into ½ inch chunks  
4 scallions, sliced thin  
4 ears corn, kernels cut off from cob  
1 garlic clove, minced  
2 T chopped fresh basil

Whisk ¼ cup of the olive oil, the vinegar, and 1½ tsp salt and the pepper together in a large bowl. Add butter beans, tomatoes, zucchini, and scallions and toss to combine.

Heat remaining oil in a 12-inch nonstick skillet over medium high heat until shimmering. Add corn and remaining ½ tsp salt and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened and just beginning to brown, 5 to 7 minutes. Add the garlic and cook until fragrant, about 30 seconds.

Transfer corn mixture to the bowl with the butter bean mixture and toss to combine. Let stand for at least 30 minutes to allow flavors to meld. Cover and refrigerate until ready to serve. Will keep for several days.

Stir in the basil just before serving.
