Making the Blocks (Continued)


1. Sew a 1"×10½" colored strip (which you cut in part 2) to each of 15 semicircle units. Press seams open.




Sew another semicircle unit of another color to this. Press seams open. This is a finished circle block.



- Repeat steps 2-3 to make 15 circle blocks of assorted color combinations.
- 4. Sew 5 circle blocks into a row. Press the seams open.



5. Repeat step 4 two more times to make a total of 3 rows.



Cut about 90—3" wide strips varying from 2"-5" long of assorted colors.



7. Reduce your stitch length about 20% and sew these strips end-to-end to make 7 pieced strips that are roughly 40" long. The smaller stitch length will help prevent the seams from coming apart as you handle the strip. If you don't have quite enough, just cut more pieces. Press seams open.
