I did not think there would be so much interest in this workshop. First if you want to goggle 'twister quilt Missouri quilt co' they do an easy wreath using the five " squares. Another hint is you loose about 25% of the size of your original blocks. If you want to do a table runner just to try out the pattern you could definitely finish that in one day. If you have your own tool please bring it - we are also willing to share We have rulers for 2 1/2', 3 1/2', 5' and 6 1/2" and there is a 10" that you can still buy on the internet. To make a table runner I would suggest 6 blocks down and 14 blocks across with 5" squares and a border of 3 1/2"

Supplies for the class are: cutting mat

new blade in your rotary cutter blocks sewn together with the border on and pressed. If you have the twister tool please bring it, sewing machine regular sewing supplies
