Workshop will be "Strata" which includes curved piecing, organza circles stitched with single or double needle, and yarns will be couched to the surface for movement and definition. A limited amount of fabric, yarn, thread and silk organza will be available for purchase during the class or purchase a kit for \$30. 

PICTORIAL DIRECTORY – Vivian Oaks

We have a pictorial directory that will be available to all members as soon as possible following the November meeting. If you are a new member, or a member who wasn't available to have a picture taken, or just didn't get a picture in the directory, we'd like to get a new picture of you! You can either send me one of your own (individual head shot) or see me before or after the Quilt Guild Meeting so I can take a picture of you. (Check back at the Block Lotto table.) A correct directory helps us to identify members we haven't met yet and gives us email and postal addresses, as well as phone numbers so we can contact each other.

In order to access the online pictorial directory, you will need to sign in to the website to access the member-only page. Surprisingly, the website statistics show that only 30 members have signed in for access to the member-only page! You NEED access to this page to get all the information you should have as a member of the guild. It's very easy to access this area of the website. Go to the Home page, where you will see a small blue oval, next to the dove on the left side of the page, that says "Members Only." Click on this and it will take you to the sign-in/sign-up page. If you haven't signed in previously,

- 1) click on the member-only button on the home page.
- 2) On the Log-In page, click to the right of the words, "New to this site?" on the words "Sign up."
- 3) On the "Sign-up" page, enter your email and choose a password.
- 4) Click to sign up. (At this point, I will be notified of someone requesting access to the member-only page. If I recognize the email, I will give permission as soon as I see the notification. If I don't recognize the email, I will reply to the email, asking for identification. Once you let me know who you are, if you're a paid member, I will immediately give access to the member-only page.) This prevents non-members from accessing sensitive information.

- 5) Once permission is given, go again to the Log-In Page, fill in your email and password, and this time click on the "Sign-In" button under your password. To make it easier, have your computer or tablet save your email and password so that it fills in automatically the next time you go to the page.

OTHER INFORMATION ON THE MEMBERS-ONLY PAGE

For those who've never been on the members-only page, you will find a plethora of information, such as: Our Constitution, Guidelines, Meeting Minutes, Pictorial Directory, the Officer & Committee Chair list, and a member-only area to sell items to other members of the guild. There have been a couple of nice sewing machines listed on this page for a while now. Check it out!

GRAPE SALAD from Christine Huska

Combine in Large Bowl:

1 8-oz. pkg. Cream Cheese

¼ cup sugar

1 cup Greek Yogurt

1 tsp. Vanilla

Fold into above combined ingredients:

4 lbs. red/green grapes, cut in half if large

Chill 1 hour or overnight

Prior to serving, mix together and add on top:

¾ cup brown sugar

1 cup walnuts/pecans, chopped
